## **Mrs. Annie V. Bryant**



She is described as quiet, humble, sweet, hard-working and a lovely person on the inside and on the outside. Those descriptive words rang true when I arrived at her neatly furnished home, the first thing she said was, "Give me a hug." She is **Mrs. Annie V. Bryant**, a long-time devoted member of Pleasant Hill Baptist Church. It is fitting that the member chosen to be featured in the first edition of *The Hill Messenger* would be someone who is unsung and very deserving of recognition.

Mrs. Bryant was born in Shreveport on August 8, 1937 to the late Emma and Nathaniel Lewis. Due to her father's early death, she and her mother came to reside with her maternal grandfather in Westdale, Louisiana. At age 11, Mrs. Bryant confessed Christ and was baptized at Elizabeth Baptist Church in Westdale. She attended school in Red River Parish and later in the Caddo Parish school system. She became a member of Pleasant Hill in 1957. Years later, she married Herman Bryant and remained his loyal wife for 36 years until his passing in 2005. Over the years, Mrs. Bryant spent her time being employed as a housekeeper and embracing her role as a wife and mother. She is blessed with a son, Johnnie, and two step-children, Kenneth and Herman, whom she maintains a very close and loving relationship.

For many years she served faithfully as a member of the Pastor's Aide Society, Inspirational Chorus, and Mission Circle. She never desired to be in the forefront, but was quite content being in the background working steadfastly to get things done to benefit of the church. Now retired from full-time employment, she currently does part-time adult sitting and keeps a watchful eye on those in need of her assistance. For instance, she utilized her vehicle for years to transport members in need of a ride to church and continues to provide assistance to those in need even today. With that big, lovingly smile, she said, "I love to help people and I love making people happy ... It makes me feel good to be recognized but I never worked to get recognition ... I serve because I love people and believe in living each day as if it's my last."

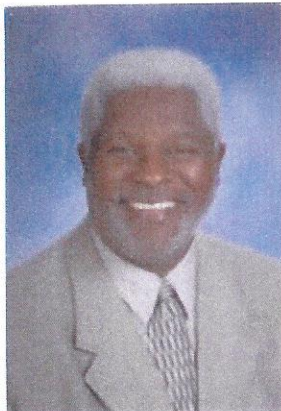

## TOPS (Take off Pounds Sensibly)



TOPS LA Chapter 0523 Shreveport, established a local chapter at Pleasant Hill Baptist Church to help participants in their weight loss efforts. This chapter is open, not only to PHBC members, but to citizens in the community. The mission of the chapter is to help and support members' efforts to lose weight and keep it off sensibly. The group encourages each other to follow sound nutrition and exercise plans to reach weigh goals set by their healthcare professionals to also help them live healthier lifestyles.

The first TOPS meeting was held on January 17, 2011 at the church, and currently, there are 30-plus members who meet weekly. Since its first meeting, members of Chapter LA0523 Shreveport have lost over 600 pounds. The group is led by **Sister Vivian Andrews**, director. Membership is affordable at a monthly fee (usually \$5.00). Members can anticipate the following: caring, supportive friends to help them take off and keep off pounds sensibly; weekly, confidential weigh-ins to provide personal accountability and a progress record; informational programs on the importance of nutritional balance, portion controls, regular physical activity, behavioral change and stress management in achieving weight loss and better health; and members are awarded and recognized for eating healthy and increasing activity, as well as achieving reaching their goal.

## 2015 Kiwanis Club of Shreveport Spirit of Christmas Food Drive

The **Annual Kiwanis Club Food Drive** was held Saturday, December 19, 2015. Kiwanis is a global organization of volunteers dedicated to improving the world one child and one community at a time! 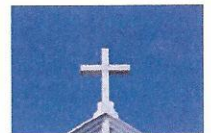
