From the Pastor's Desk



I am sure you are familiar with the cliché, “if you continue to do the same thing, you will continue to get the same results.” The truth of the matter is that, because things around us are constantly changing, if we continue doing the same things, we will not get the same results. Instead, our once fruitful results begin to decrease and could possibly disappear altogether.

Here is one illustration demonstrating why. What store can you go to today with a dollar and get the same amount as you did ten years ago? Five years ago? Two years ago? One year ago? Either one of at least three things have occurred: The price for products has increased, the amount (quantity) of a particular product once received, decreases, or the quality of the products diminishes, making it less valuable. Therefore, those who continue to carry a dollar to the store in order to make a purchase are getting less, in one form or another, year after year after year.

The same principle demonstrated in the above example is applicable to our faith. We cannot possess the same amount of faith from day to day, year after year, and then expect to get where God wants to take us. When our faith is stagnant, we are not growing (maturing) in our relationship with Jesus Christ. By virtue of who we are, and who’s we are, we must allow our faith to grow. We must be willing to step out in faith, to get out of our comfort zone, and start responding to God’s directions even if he is leading us to do something different, something so outlandish we haven’t a clue what the outcome will be!

We must be willing to let our faith lead us to where God wants to take us. Let’s get out of “our” comfort zone and then move into the new territory God has prepared and destined for us. Now is the time... and if not now, then when?

For over 60 years, PHBC has been blessed to have the faithful membership of **Sis. Daisy Lee Tanner**. She is a friendly, personable lady who has enjoyed being a member of the church, and she really loves having a place to worship along with other members, many of whom she considers as close friends.

Since her baptism in 1953 by then pastor, the late Reverend C.E. Martin, she is proud of the fact that she has been a loyal member of the church and have given active service throughout the years. Sis. Tanner has been described by others as a lady who works quietly behind the scenes; she is not boastful, instead, she lets her work, her generosity, and her love of God speak for her. She said, "What I like most about PHBC is the church family

atmosphere, Pastor Armington, and the members."

Sis. Tanner was born and reared in Shreveport. She is the youngest of six children born to the late Issac and Aslee Parsee. She was educated in the Caddo Parish School System, having attended Brooks Street Elementary School, Central Jr. High School, and Booker T. Washington High School.

Sis. Tanner began her work in the church early as a teenager and continued to serve throughout her young adult years with membership in the Red Circle. She held a remarkable 50-year membership with the choir. During her teens, she sang in the Junior Choir, and later as an adult, she became a member of the Adult Choir. She truly enjoyed singing and serving in the choir, but unfortunately, she dropped her membership a few years ago due to health reasons causing the loss of her voice.

She was married to the late Richard Tanner, and to this union, seven children were born: Carl, Bruce, Barbara, Kathy, Donna, Ronald, and Gail. She also has ten grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. When asked of what she is most proud, she said, "I'm most proud of being a child of God and of being a mother."

The one incident that brought Sis. Tanner much closer to God happened over 25 years ago, when she was hospitalized. "I was in a lot of pain," she said, "but God brought me through, and that is why I am happy to serve Him and follow His word." She added, "The advice my mother gave me long ago was to 'Keep the Lord in my life and heart,' and I've kept those words and clung to them all of my life." Sis. Tanner passed this advice on to her children as well, and she added, "I also advise my children to treat people the way they want to be treated."

Sister Tanner retired over 20 years ago after spending 21 years as a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA). Prior to her retirement, she received an award from her job for outstanding service as a CNA because of the excellent care she provided to her patients.

Amazingly, one of her hobbies is cleaning, a task that most people seem to dislike performing! Unfortunately, because Sis. Tanner has gone through two hip surgeries, she can't do as much cleaning at the level she's done in the past. The hobby that she enjoys even more than cleaning is cooking. She said, "My family and friends love all of the dishes I cook, but the one consistent item that I receive the most requests for is my special pound cake."

Sis. Tanner said, "My favorite biblical scripture is Psalms 23 because the Lord has been so good to me, and He's brought me from a mighty long way ... and He's the one who wakes me up every day. Psalms 23 reminds me of God's promises, and I really, really enjoy serving the Lord."

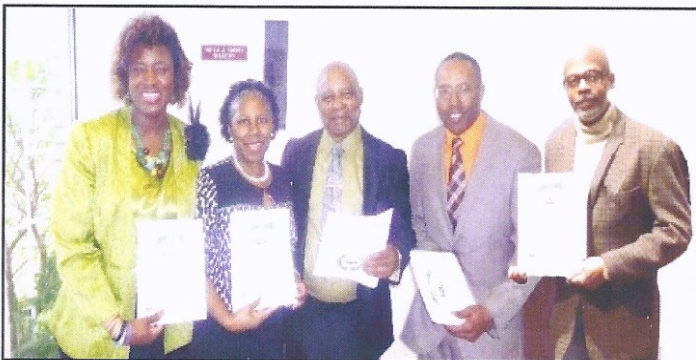

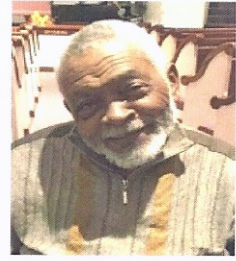

BROTHER LOUIS BROOKS BECAME NEW DEACON AT PHBC



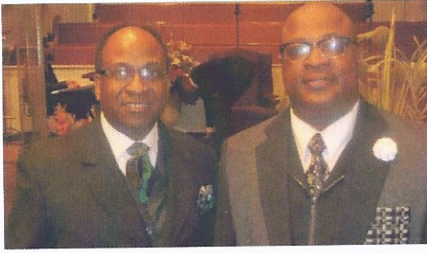

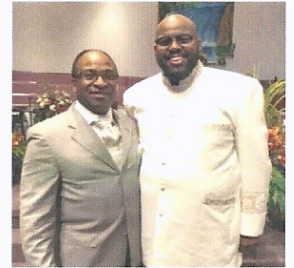


ANNUAL MEN & WOMEN DAY HELD

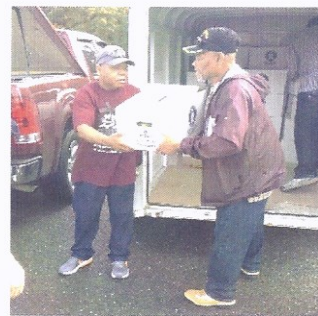

ORIGINAL RECIPE

Spanish Casserole

Ingredients:

- 1 lb. ground beef or turkey
- 1 pkg. Spanish Rice a Roni
- Small pkg. Velveta Cheese
- 1 can of Pace Picante Sauce
- 1 can Ranch Style Beans



Directions:

Cook ground beef or turkey and set aside. Cook the Rice a Roni according to the package. When the rice is done, mix it with the ground beef, beans, and Picante Sauce. Transfer the mixture to a casserole dish and layer it with the Velveta cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for approximately five minutes or until cheese melts.
